- The doors and windows will be vinyl, similar in appearance to what was there before.

#### 8.2.1.2 480 Glass Street - Junction Station

Building Inspector, Jason Silcox, spoke to DEV 26-2020 480 Glass Street Heritage Application. Applicant, Ryan Leaman, responded to questions from the Committee.

The applicant provided the following details:

- The walls will be insulated and covered in drywall to improve energy efficiency, but the same interior footprint and openings will be kept.
- The west third of the building, the production area, will have its doors covered over but they will still appear the same from outside.
- Potlights will be added to the exterior of the building to improve safety and illuminate the proposed patio area.
- The applicant is striving to save the partition wall in the southwest corner of the building while accommodating a retail cooler planned for this space.
