DEPARTMENTAL HIGHLIGHTS

Administration/Funding:

- Due to provincial covid-19 restrictions, the Museum and Archives closed on Wednesday, January 4, reopening on Monday, January 31. The Museum is currently open Monday to Friday, 9am to 4pm for drop-in tours at 50% capacity. The Archives is open by appointment only.
- Staff have applied to Young Canada Works for two summer positions, Canada Summer Jobs for one summer position, and Young Canada Works Building Careers in Heritage for a 25week internship position.
- The Museum and Archives brought in \$66,164 in revenue (\$44,810 budgeted) and obtained \$159,291 in expenses (\$166,757 budgeted) for a net impact of \$93,127 (\$121,947 budgeted).

Programming and Exhibits:

- James Brine: Tolpuddle Martyr and Leaving Footprints opened at the Christmas Open House on December 5.
- Plans underway for 2022 virtual heritage fair.
- Plans underway for 2022 historic photo recreation contest, following successful contest in February 2021.
- Staff have established an exhibits, events, and programming plan for 2022. Highlights include supporting Homecoming/Heritage and reviving Melodies at the Museum.

Collections Management:

- YCW Intern has accessioned all 2021 donations.
- YCW Intern working on processing backlog of archival donations, dating back to pre-2010.

Statistics:

Staff responded to 11 research requests in December and 14 in January.
